

Why did Yahuweh/Yehovah Create Man?

The most logical place in Scripture for Yahuweh/Yehovah to reveal why he created man would be at the very beginning in Genesis when he creates man.

But even in the account of creation I could not find the answer to the reason why, until all of a sudden I remembered, "And Elohim saw that it was good." And suddenly I realized that Yahuweh/Yehovah did reveal the purpose why he created man right at the very beginning at creation.
